

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Warranties by Submitter

1. By submitting an abstract intended for presentation at the Congress, the submitter warrants that all material in the abstract(s) **will not** have been previously published in any publication or publicly presented at any meeting or event(s) of any other scientific organization before the World Congress of Dermatology 2023 and does not contain any unlawful or libellous material or material that infringes upon the intellectual property rights of any other third party, including rights to enforce confidentiality obligations. Where the abstract contains updated data previously presented or published elsewhere, the submitter must provide additional information specifying what is the new or updated data proposed to be presented or published, supply information in relation to the prior presentation or publication (including name of meeting/event, year, date and publication number), as well as a copy of the previous presentation or publication for comparison. Failure to comply with the above will result in rejection of the submitted abstract.
2. The submitter also warrants that he or she has the full power, authority and capacity to submit the abstract and agree to these terms and conditions. Where the abstract is prepared by more than one author, the Submitter warrants that he or she has informed the co-authors of the abstract and has obtained their express consent to the submission of the abstract in accordance with the terms and conditions herein.

Consent to Publication and Assignment of Copyright

3. Abstracts accepted will be published in the exact form submitted. Therefore, submitters are to ensure that all information submitted is correct and accurate. Submitted abstracts can be modified until **24 September 2022** (the abstract submission deadline). Please remove the abstract previously submitted and upload the new document. Authors who wish to withdraw their abstract must send a written request to: wcd2023abstract@thetriumph.com.
4. By submitting an abstract, the submitter expressly agrees to the following:
 - a. The submitter warrants that he or she is the author of the original material contained in the abstract and warrants that the proprietor of all rights in copyright pertaining to the abstract (which may in certain cases may not be the submitter or author but the author's employer) and/or any other co-authors of the abstract, agrees to all the terms of the Abstract Submission Regulations including all terms relating to the assignment of copyright set out below.
 - b. In consideration of Congress accepting the abstract for publishing and the professional benefits arising from such publication, the submitter (including any co-authors) and/or proprietor of all rights in copyright pertaining to the abstract agrees to the assignment of all rights in copyright in relation to the abstract to the International League of Dermatological Societies ("ILDS"), including but not limited to:
 - i. The right to publish the abstract in print, electronic form or any other medium;

- ii. The non-exclusive right to grant permission to third parties to re-publish the abstract in whole or in part without having to obtain further permission from the proprietor;

Confidentiality of Abstract(s)

- 7. Abstracts submitted to Congress are considered confidential by Congress until publicly presented and/or published in connection with the Congress. Prior to such presentation or publishing, the author(s), research sponsors, or proprietors of the copyright in the abstract(s) may not make the information public or use the information for trading purposes without obtaining prior written permission from Congress.
